**DeKalb to continue storm debris clean-up**

**Brookhaven, GA, July 2, 2013** – DeKalb County sanitation crews are increasing pick-ups for remaining storm debris, according to information obtained today by the City of Brookhaven.

Nine sanitation crews in the north district, which includes Brookhaven, will focus solely on storm debris pick-ups, said Billy Malone, DeKalb's assistant director of sanitation.

County crews will continue the special collection storm yard debris service Saturday and Monday. Regular sanitation solid waste crews will service their routes on Friday because of the holiday.

As of today, sanitation crews still had about 40 percent of homes to service for pick-up of bagged yard debris. About 150 DeKalb residents have been notified of special pick-up assessments for remaining storm debris. Sanitation crews were averaging about 10-15 storm debris pick-ups per day depending on the size.

Last weekend, DeKalb crews collected more than 150 tons of storm debris.
